As the joy of the Christmas season fills the air, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on some of the successful accomplishments at the Meridian Housing Authority over the past twelve months:

Several MHA residents completed mandatory requirements of the agency's Family Self-Sufficiency prograr and are now successful homeowners in the Meridian Community. Concerned citizens of the Meridian East End, along with residents of the George Reese and Magnolia Courts housing developments, participated in two Community Pride Clean-Up Days during the month of April.

MHA received national recognition from the Depart-

ment of Housing and Urban Development by receiving the HUD "High Performance" designation.

Eight (8) deserving graduating seniors received monetary scholarship awards from MHA's Board of Commissioners.

In April, MHA received a nine (9%) tax credit allocation from the Mississippi Home Corporation to revitalize (80) units of affordable housing owned by the agency. Pre-Kindergarten educational services through the Meridian Public School District are now available to the residents of the Western Gardens community.

The construction of ten(10) new homes is near completion and will be utilized under MHA's new homeownership Transition Program (HTP).

Several informative rallies were conducted at six (6) MHA housing communities to inform the public of the new Positive Behavioral Intervention Support Model or (PBIS) geared toward the enforcement of positive behavioral methods throughout the Meridian Public School District.

MHA hosted its first Annual Spelling Bee Contest. The Office Next Door (OND) initiative was implemented along with the development of the partnership with Meridian Community College to start a class at the Frank Berry Center for MHA residents.

I would like to express my deepest appreciation to the staff, resident advisory leadership and all collaborative partnerships for making these accomplishments possible.

Finally, let us not forget the true meaning of this glorious season. May God richly bless you and your family.


