Meridian Housing Authority's Procurement Workshop Draws Huge Response


More than forty (40) business owners from the Meridian vicinity and across the state of Missis-



The Commissioners, staff and residents of the Meridian Housing Authority remain dedicated to providing quality, affordable housing opportunities to over 1,235 families in its area of responsibility. Several major initiatives ensure that our residents and employees enjoy a friendly, efficient and professional environment.

MHA will continue in its quest to provide quality housing through its newest initiative known as the Veteran Affairs Supportive Housing "VASH" voucher program.

The Department of Housing and Urban Development has awarded MHA approximately \$61,734.00 to provide housing assistance to local veterans experiencing chronic homelessness. We are also pleased to partner with the Jackson Veteran Administration Medical Center which will provide care management and clinical services to veteran families qualifying under the HUD-VASH program. After the Veteran's Administration determined the critical need to assist homeless veterans in Meridian, HUD awarded MHA the funding necessary to implement the VASH initiative.

MHA's high administrative performance designation played a key role in

HUD's decision to fund the much needed veteran's effort in Meridian.

MHA will provide local office space for the homeless veteran's program in an effort to expedite the VA's ability to provide permanent housing solutions for (10) deserving families. MHA exist to provide affordable housing for over 3,500 eligible citizens.



The Housing Operations Department wants to express the importance of timely rental payments. This may defer court cost that creates a challenge and possibly provide a rent reduction upon review.

Please contact your property manager regarding all rental concerns immediately.

In regards to Community Service, each adult member of the household must perform unless otherwise exempt. You are required to complete 8 hours per month of community service or economic self-sufficiency activities; a combination of both activities. To get a copy of the exemption requirements, contact Keondria Knox at (601) 693-4285, ext. 236.

The community service program is intended to provide a rewarding activity that will assist Meridian Housing Authority residents in improving their own and their neighbor's economic and social well-being and to give residents a greater stake in their communities.
