The Census is a count of every person who lives in the United States and its territories. It happens every 10 years. During the Census, you will be asked to count everyone who lives in your

home as of **April 1**. What's in it for me you might ask? Your participation depends heavily on how your city is funded which includes funding for schools, clinics, and roads. Your responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure, and protected by federal law. Census takers will never ask for Social Security numbers, bank or credit card numbers, money or donations of any kind. Identification must be shown at all time. We ask that you please participate in the 2020 Census Count. If you are looking for a part-time job, visit 2020census.gov/jobs or call 1-855-JOB-2020 and apply online today. Valid transportation is required.
